**Subject:** Formal Complaint Regarding Year-Round TFR Over Palm Beach Airspace

Dear Sir or Madam,

On behalf of the residents and leadership of the Town of Palm Beach, I am submitting this formal complaint pursuant to 14 CFR §13.5 regarding the ongoing Temporary Flight Restriction (TFR) imposed over Palm Beach County airspace, which remains in effect year-round—even during extended periods when the President is not in residence.

This blanket restriction has resulted in significant and measurable disruption to our community, including:

- **Excessive Aircraft Noise:** The rerouting of general aviation and commercial traffic has created new flight paths directly over residential neighborhoods, leading to elevated noise levels that compromise quality of life, public health, and property values.
- **Emergency Response Delays:** Medevac and trauma transport operations have reported clearance delays due to the rigid TFR protocols, posing risks to time-sensitive medical emergencies.
- **Lack of Transparency and Justification:** The continued enforcement of the TFR in the absence of presidential presence lacks clear justification and appears inconsistent with the FAA's stated mission to balance safety, efficiency, and community impact.

We respectfully request that the FAA reevaluate the necessity and scope of this TFR, particularly its duration and geographic footprint. We further urge the agency to engage with local stakeholders, including municipal leadership, airport authorities, and affected residents, to develop a more responsive and adaptive airspace management strategy.

Palm Beach is proud to host national leadership, but we believe that security and civic harmony are not mutually exclusive. We welcome dialogue and stand ready to collaborate on solutions that uphold both.
