

FINES

- The fine for violations regarding depositing of feces and removal of feces (Sec. 10-4) are:

First Offense.....\$250

Second & Subsequent Offenses..\$500

- The fine for violations regarding collars & tags (Sec. 10-42) and running at large (Sec. 10-43) are:

First Offense.....\$ 75

Second Offense..... \$125

Third Offense.....\$250

Subsequent Offenses.....\$500

- The fine for violations regarding animals prohibited on certain beaches (Sec. 74-191) are:

First Offense.....\$125

Second Offense.....\$250

Third Offense.....\$400

Subsequent Offenses.....\$500

The Palm Beach Police Department enforces violations of the Town of Palm Beach Code of Ordinances.

These ordinances may be different from those of other municipalities, so animal owners should familiarize themselves with the law as it pertains to the Town of Palm Beach.

Individuals cited for violations of the Town of Palm Beach Code of Ordinances have the right to appeal the violation before the Code Enforcement Board.

RUNNING AT LARGE

- No dog shall run at large within the town or upon the property other than that of its owner unless the dog is running on property with the consent of the owner of the property.
- An exception shall apply to allow dogs to run unleashed on the public beaches of the town, unless otherwise prohibited (see below) where such dogs are clearly under the command of their owner or handler and where the dog is not creating a nuisance to other animals or persons using the public beach.

ANIMALS PROHIBITED

- No person shall take any animal upon certain public beaches in town, or in the surf adjacent to those beaches. Said beaches shall include the Phipps Park beach, the public beach from Royal Palm Way south to Gulfstream Road, and the Clarke Avenue beach from Barton Avenue to Seaspray Avenue.

DEPOSITING OF FECES

PROHIBITED

- It shall be unlawful for any person to allow any animal under their care to deposit on any public streets, sidewalks, parks, beaches, or other public or private premises, any feces of such animal.

REMOVAL OF FECES REQUIRED

- It shall be unlawful for any person to have any animal under their custody or control while on the public streets, sidewalks, parks, beaches, or other public or private premises other than the owner or custodian of such animal, without having on his or her person a device which would be capable of removing any feces of such animal.
- The owner or custodian of any animal is required to remove and dispose of in a sanitary manner the feces of any such animal.

DOG COLLAR & TAG

- Every owner shall provide each dog more than four months of age with a sturdy collar to which the license tag shall be securely fastened.



ADDITIONAL REMINDERS

- When walking dogs, all vehicles must be parked legally or are subject to citations.
- Open containers of alcoholic beverages are prohibited on all streets, sidewalks, bicycle paths and beaches.
- Animals left unattended in vehicles must have adequate ventilation and water.
